Field Work Candidate should contact the COM liaison to

Liturgical Practicum discuss arrangements and to get approval. A minimum of six months must be spent on Field

Work, Liturgical Practicum, and Homiletics in an Episcopal church other than the candidate's sponsoring congregation. They should be done simultaneously. Upon completion of field work, the candidate will write two letters to the COM, sending them to the Executive Assistant to the

Psychological Evaluation You must have another if your previous

Background Check

Psychological Examination was more than 36 months prior to ordination. If you go to the same psychologist, you can have an update which is less involved. The psychologist should send the report directly to the Executive

Assistant to the Canon to the Ordinary.

You must have another if your previous Background Check was more than 36 months prior to ordination. The diocese will pay for a

second one.
