Walking the Camino to Spain November 11-21, 2019 Itinerary

- DAY 1, Monday, November 11, 2019 We depart on our trans-Atlantic flight to Lisbon, Portugal. M
- **DAY 2, Tues.** Upon arrival in **Lisbon,** we meet our driver and guide and our pilgrimage journey begins. We enjoy a panoramic tour of some of Lisbon's famous sights. Dinner and overnight **Fatima**. **B**
- **DAY 3, Wed.** After breakfast we visit the **Sanctuary of Fatima**, a world renown pilgrimage site famous for the Marian Apparitions and built on the site where the Virgin Mary visited Lucia Santos and her 2 cousins Jacinta and Francisco Marto in 1916. This afternoon, we walk along the **Stations of the Cross** and to the tiny village where the three young children lived. After dinner, we participate in the nightly **torchlight procession**. Dinner and overnight **Fátima**. **BD**
- **DAY 4, Thurs.** Our journey continues to the beautiful pilgrim town of **Ponte de Lima**, one of the oldest towns in Portugal. We continue on to **Valencia do Minho**, the last Portuguese town on our journey, the starting point of our **Camino Walk**. After lunch, we walk 3 km across the **River Minho**, by way of the metal bridge inspired by the work of the famous Gustave Eiffel, from **Portugal** to **Tui**, **Spain**. We visit the **Cathedral of Santa Maria de las Asunción de Tui**, a late Romanesque and Gothic-style Roman Catholic church located in the center of town. Dinner and overnight **Tui**. **B**
- **DAY 5, Fri. Tui** to **Mos** (approx. 23 km). The walk today is not strenuous. It is a good start that gives you time to set your pace. Once everyone arrives in **Mos**, the bus returns us to **Tui** for overnight. **B**
- **DAY 6, Sat. Mos** to **Pontevedra** (30 km). We have an early morning departure. Today is the most challenging of our pilgrimage walks. We pass through busy towns and coastal villages. Dinner and overnight **Pontevedra**. **B**
- **DAY 7, Sun. Pontevedra** to **Caldas de Rei** (22 km). After the storm comes the calm. We enjoy a lighter walk today through beautiful scenery. It is a great moment to reflect and let your inner thoughts guide your day. **Caldas de Rei** is a small medieval spa town. The famous **hot thermal springs** will be a treat for the feet. Dinner and overnight in **Caldas de Rei**. **BD**
- **DAY 8, Mon. Caldas de Rei** to **Padron** (approx. 19 km). We walk through hamlets, forests, and vineyards today. **Padron**, one of the most emblematic sites on the **Camino** known as **Iria Flavia**, is the town where the boat with the body of St James arrived just after his death. This boat was moored to a 'pedron', hence this name becoming more popular and the town, centuries ago, became known as **Padron**. We visit the **Church of Santiago** to see the **Pedron Stone**. Dinner and overnight **Padron**. **BD**

DAY 9, Tues. - Padron to Santiago de Compostela (approx. 25 km). Today our destination is reached. The path has been the same but the journey so different for every one of us. Our walk ends at Obradoiro Square, one of the largest squares in Galicia, which serves as an important symbol of Santiago de Compostela. Overnight Santiago de Compostela. BD

DAY 10, Wed. – We enjoy a morning visit to the Pilgrim Office to collect the Compostelanas (certificate of completion of the Camino de Santiago) and attend the Pilgrims Mass at the Cathedral. This afternoon, we travel to Finisterre, end of the world, as it was known in centuries past. Here we walk the last couple of kilometers that takes us to the lighthouse. It is here, after walking a further 4 days from Santiago de Compostela, that many pilgrims end their journey. It is here, also, that we shall have our final reflection, share our thoughts and enjoy the sunset before returning to Santiago for overnight. BL.

DAY 11, Thursday, November 21, 2019 - We have an early morning departure for Santiago de Compostela Airport where we board our flight to Madrid. There we transfer to our flight back home. BM
