SO, WHAT'S NEXT?

Discernment after receiving Vitality Assessment results

From your Vitality Assessment Results, page 2:

Consider this the beginning of discernment, not the end of it. Remember, this report is not a judgment of your congregation or its ministries. Rather, it is an assessment of its current state based on the perceptions of your worshipers and leaders.

START THE CONVERSATION with your leaders

- Meet with leadership/staff/clergy and talk about your strengths, what stands out, what it means for your congregation.
- Look for areas where leadership and worshipers have a difference in overall score of more than 10%.
- Make decisions about HOW to talk to the congregation and what possible first steps might be.

CONTINUE THE CONVERSATION, broadening your circle

- Talk to the congregation about the results and ask for their thoughts, talk about what it means, where you go. Some suggestions about how to do this:
 - Celebrate your strength(s) in a worship service, during announcements, or at coffee hour, faith formation, etc.
 - Send out communications that include the front page of your report and invite the congregation to a meeting to discuss the questions more in-depth.
 - o Have an insert or page of your bulletin celebrating your greatest strength.
 - o Invite leaders and ministry volunteers up to talk about what your greatest strength means to them in their spiritual life and ministry work.
 - Ask ministry leaders to have formal or informal conversations about the results in their ministry meetings or communications.
 - Meet with those who facilitate youth and children's ministries, to see how these results might be communicated to those who did not participate (under 15).

DISCERNMENT & STEPPING FORWARD

- Meet with leadership again to discern next steps: What do we do next? Where does our energy go? Do we further our greatest strength, or concentrate on those areas where we have the opportunity for improvement?
- After determining your next steps, call on the resources of the Office of the Bishop and other congregations in your Region. You do not have to go it alone.
