The mission of the Diocesan Race Task Force is to address and deconstruct the institutional and structural racism in the leadership bodies of the church and our broader society.

Following Diocesan Convention in 2017, in response to feedback, we are in the process of adding additional dimensions to our mission

Formed following the Episcopal Church in Colorado's Annual Convention in 2016, the Race Task Force first spent time sharing our stories, practicing vulnerability to build a foundation of trust, modeling a way of interacting that we believe should characterize this work. Working from that base of trust and vulnerability, we got to work researching the role race continues to play in disparities of income, health, and quality of life in Colorado. The Race Task Force has now begun organizing new members into three teams: leadership and vision, education, and research. The Race Task Force will continue its work equipping faith communities to boldly and prophetically address racism in their neighborhoods, communities, and state.
