MI DERECHO DE MANTENER MI SILENCIO

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Please be informed that I am choosing to exercise my right to remain silent and the right to refuse to answer your questions, based on my 5th Amendment rights. If I am detained or arrested, I request to contact my attorney immediately. I am also exercising my right to refuse to sign anything until I consult with my attorney.

Under the 4th Amendment, I do not give you permission to enter my home unless you have a warrant to enter, by court order. I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings.

SI UD. ES DETENIDO/A, DELE ESTA TARJETA AL OFICIAL Y MANTENGA SU SILENCIO.

PETICIONES DE BÚSQUEDAS SI LE ARRESTAN

1. Ud. tiene el derecho de ver una orden de arresto si ICE u otro oficial intenta entrar a su casa o su vehículo.
2. Pida que pasen la orden de arresto debajo de su puerta sin abrirla, para no darles entender que le está dando consentimiento de entrar a su casa.
3. Si el oficial tiene una orden de arresto, fíjese si el oficial busca áreas hacia fuera de los áreas alistados en la orden de arresto. Pida un recibo por cualquier propiedad que tomen.

1. Entérase de quién le arrestó. Escriba el nombre de los oficiales, sus agencias, y sus números de identificación y placas.
2. No firme ningún documento sin hablar primero con un abogado. SIEMPRE tiene el derecho de hablar con un abogado. ¡No sea engañado por trucos de intimidación ni amenazas que usan los oficiales para que firme documentos!
3. Llame al Bufete Meyer, (303) 831-0817. Le podemos ayudar con fianzas, holds (ordenes de detención) de ICE, y su caso criminal o caso migratorio.

SI LE INTERROGAN POR LA POLICÍA O ICE

Ud. tiene el derecho de preguntar el oficial si lo están arrestando o deteniendo.

Si el oficial dice que no le están arrestando ni deteniendo, pregúntele al oficial si puede irse. *Si el oficial dice que puede irse, váyase lentamente.*

Si el oficial dice que lo van a detener o arrestar, TIENE EL DERECHO DE MANTENERSE CALLADO. Si le requieren identificarse, de sólo su nombre verdadero y su fecha de nacimiento. Aparte de eso, tiene el derecho de mantenerse callado.

Demuestra el otro lado de esta tarjeta al oficial.

PREGUNTAS SOBRE EL ESTATUS MIGRATORIO:

1. No conteste ninguna pregunta. Sólo diga: "I need to speak to my lawyer (Necesito hablar con mi abogado)." Pida un intérprete si no habla bien el inglés.
2. No diga nada sobre dónde nació ni cómo entró a los Estados Unidos.
3. Si usted carga documentos o identificación de otro país, pueden ser utilizados en su contra.

¡Nunca miente a los oficiales! ¡Nunca entregue documentos ni información falsa!

MY RIGHT TO REMAIN SILENT

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Please be informed that I am choosing to exercise my right to remain silent and the right to refuse to answer your questions, based on my 5th Amendment rights. If I am detained or arrested, I request to contact my attorney immediately. I am also exercising my right to refuse to sign anything until I consult with my attorney.

Under the 4th Amendment, I do not give you permission to enter my home unless you have a warrant to enter, by court order. I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings.

IF YOU ARE DETAINED, HAND THIS CARD TO THE OFFICIAL AND REMAIN SILENT.

REQUESTS TO SEARCH

1. You have the right to see a warrant if ICE or another government officer tries to enter your home or your vehicle.
2. Ask that the warrant be slipped under your door, or else you may be seen as consenting to the officer entering your home.
3. If the officer has a warrant, look whether the officer searches outside areas listed in the warrant. Get a receipt for any property taken.

IF YOU ARE ARRESTED

1. Find out who arrested you. Write down the name of the officers and their agencies, along with ID numbers and plate numbers.
2. Don't sign any documents without speaking to a lawyer. You always have the right to speak to a lawyer. Don't fall for intimidation or other tricks officials may use to try to get you to sign documents!
3. **Call The Meyer Law Office, (303) 831-0817.** We can help you with bond, ICE holds, and your criminal or immigration case.

IF YOU ARE QUESTIONED BY POLICE/ICE

You have the right to ask the officer if you are being arrested or detained.

If the officer says you are not being arrested or detained, ask the officer if you may leave. If the officer says you may leave, *slowly and calmly walk away.*

If the officer says you are being detained or arrested, **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO REMAIN SILENT.** If required to identify yourself, give only your real name and date of birth. Otherwise, you have the right to remain silent.

Show the officer the back of this card.

QUESTIONS ABOUT IMMIGRATION STATUS:

1. Do not answer any questions. Say only: "I need to speak to my lawyer." Request an interpreter if you don't speak English fluently.
2. Do not say anything about where you were born or if or how you entered the United States.
3. If you choose to carry immigration documents or identification from another country, they may be used against you.

Never lie to an officer or give him/her false documents or information!
