

#### THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

(Congregation is seated for the readings. All readings are from the NRSV translation of the Bible.)

THE FIRST LESSON 2 Kings 5:1-3, 7-15c

**Reader:** A reading from the Second Book of Kings

Naaman, commander of the army of the king of Aram, was a great man and in high favor with his master, because by him the LORD had given victory to Aram. The man, though a mighty warrior, suffered from leprosy. Now the Arameans on one of their raids had taken a young girl captive from the land of Israel, and she served Naaman's wife. She said to her mistress, "If only my lord were with the prophet who is in Samaria! He would cure him of his leprosy." When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and said, "Am I God, to give death or life, that this man sends word to me to cure a man of his leprosy? Just look and see how he is trying to pick a quarrel with me."

But when Elisha the man of God heard that the king of Israel had torn his clothes, he sent a message to the king, "Why have you torn your clothes? Let him come to me, that he may learn that there is a prophet in Israel." So Naaman came with his horses and chariots, and halted at the entrance of Elisha's house. Elisha sent a messenger to him, saying, "Go, wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored and you shall be clean." But Naaman became angry and went away, saying, "I thought that for me he would surely come out, and stand and call on the name of the LORD his God, and would wave his hand over the spot, and cure the leprosy! Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Could I not wash in them, and be clean?" He turned and went away in a rage. But his servants approached and said to him, "Father, if the prophet had commanded you to do something difficult, would you not have done it? How much more, when all he said to you was, 'Wash, and be clean'?" So he went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, according to the word of the man of God; his flesh was restored like the flesh of a young boy, and he was clean.

Then he returned to the man of God, he and all his company; he came and stood before him and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel."

THE SECOND LESSON 2 Timothy 2:8-15

**Reader**: A reading from the second letter of Timothy

Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David ~ that is my gospel, for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. The saying is sure:

If we have died with him, we will also live with him;

if we endure, we will also reign with him;

if we deny him, he will also deny us;

if we are faithless, he remains faithful --

for he cannot deny himself.

Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

For our future, that you will raise us all up as instruments of healing and reconciliation, that we may maintain constant love for one another and proclaim Christ's saving work in all parts of our lives, we pray to you, O Lord. *We have a witness yet to make.* 

For the coming of your kingdom, that our lives may testify to your justice and peace and that we may be for others signs of your reign that is already at work among us, we pray to you. O Lord.

#### LITANIST 4: A LITANY FOR OUR COMMUNITY REALITIES

We pray for continued blessings on all peacemakers, on leaders who value peace, and on everyone who promotes nonviolent solutions to conflict. We pray for a speedy end to all violence and warfare around the world. Show forth your grace and compassion.

We pray for an end to gun violence that destroys the lives of innocent victims and wreaks havoc on our communities.

Show forth your grace and compassion.

We pray that the Holy Spirit may embrace the most vulnerable members of our society, especially those who experience discrimination, harm, and prejudice; we pray also for an end to the growing disparity between the rich and poor; and for the grace and courage to strive for economic justice.

Show forth your grace and compassion.

We pray for an end to prejudice throughout our country and the world; that we will respect all people as precious children of God; and that racism, sexism, and all other forms of discrimination, especially towards our brown, black, LGBTQIA, and transgender siblings, will be forever banished from our hearts, our society, and our laws. Show forth your grace and compassion.

We pray for the care and reverence of creation; that we will have the tools and the will to conserve it; that we will use its bountiful resources in the service of others; and that we will become better stewards of all that has been entrusted to us.

Show forth your grace and compassion.

We pray for all immigrants, refugees, and pilgrims from around the world, that they may be welcomed in our midst and be treated with fairness, dignity, and respect. That they may know safety, justice and freedom in our midst. Show forth your grace and compassion.

We pray for the sick, the aged and the infirm; for those with physical or mental disabilities; that all may have access to proper health care; and that God's loving embrace may be felt by all who suffer.

Show forth your grace and compassion.

We pray for all prisoners and captives; that a spirit of forgiveness may replace vengeance and retribution; and that we, with all the destitute, lonely, and oppressed, may be restored to the fullness of God's grace.

Show forth your grace and compassion.

We pray for all who have lost hope, have lost the joy of living, who cannot see an end to pain and suffering. We pray, O Lord, that you hold them in your loving arms so that they know they are loved, they are worthy, they are needed. We pray that we may be your hands and feet in preventing suicide in our communities.

Show forth your grace and compassion.

We pray for all who have died as a result of violence, war, disease or famine, especially those who died because of human blindness, neglect, or hardness of heart.

Show forth your grace and compassion.

For the consummation of all things in your well-beloved Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Hasten, O God, the coming of your kingdom; and grant that we, your servants, may know and love your Son, Jesus Christ, that we may be inspired by the Holy Spirit, to be good Samaritans to all we encounter, loving our neighbors as ourselves, and respecting the dignity of every human being and all of creation. *Amen.*



The People stand or kneel; the Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh.

For in these last days you sent Jesus to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In Christ, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In Christ, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with [Naaman, the unnamed Samaritan leper, and] all your saints, prophets, and witnesses, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your children; through Jesus Christ our Savior, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and forever. **AMEN**.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. 
